Safe Places Certification is a safeguarding tool that our organization has implemented to improve quality programming while reducing the potential risks to children and youth.

We require all Coaches to become Safe Places – **YOUTH CERTIFIED** and all other individuals within the organization – including staff, officials, and board members to be **COMMUNITY CERTIFIED**.

Please note: If you are applying for YOUTH CERTIFICATION - you must obtain a letter from our organization to ensure RCMP will provide you with a vulnerable sector check.
